BAM completes N25 New Ross Bypass PPP

In January, An Taoiseach Leo Varadkar, TD and Rose Katherine Kennedy Townsend officially opened the N25 New Ross Bypass PPP Scheme. Delivered by the BAM on behalf of Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII), and Wexford and Kilkenny Councils, this 15 km of road network will improve links to the South East for business and greatly reduce travel times on the strategic Cork to Rosslare corridor.

The project was funded and constructed by the BAM / ACS consortium, which will now maintain it for the next 25 years with a 20-strong team of workers. It has been delivered as a Public Private Partnership (PPP) Contract between Transport Infrastructure Ireland and the PPP company, comprising BAM PPP, PGGM Infrastructure Coöperatie U.A. and Iridium Concesiones de Infraestructuras S.A.

The Rose Fitzgerald Kennedy Bridge stretches 887 metres across the River Barrow and joins Kilkenny with Wexford. The name of the bridge celebrates the Kennedy family's rich heritage in New Ross, as their ancestral home is located in nearby Dunganstown. The bridge is the longest bridge in Ireland and the longest extradosed bridge of its type (a complex cable-stayed structure) in the world.

Speaking at the opening of the new bypass, BAM CEO Theo Cullinane said the firm was proud to have funded and delivered another vital piece of infrastructure for the State. "It is fantastic to see the N25 New Ross Bypass opened today. We are delighted to say that this project was delivered successfully and my thanks for this goes to the team involved: BAM led by Tadhg Lucey, Adrian Cunningham and Declan Roche, BAM PPP/ Iridium led by Ricardo Urién Laso; Dragados led by Horge Cordero del Val, our

designers Arup and CFC and the Employers team lead by Mary Bowe and Joe Shinkwin of Mott MacDonald.

"This is a crucial piece of infrastructure for the South East Region and it will have an immediate, tangible impact on the local community, who will enjoy reduced travel times and increased accessibility. The N25 is a strategic national route that carries both tourist and commercial traffic between Cork and Rosslare and it will improve connectivity across Munster and Leinster. Last year saw the opening of the M11 Gorey to Enniscorthy motorway, another PPP scheme co-delivered by BAM that has delivered significant benefits to the South East Region.

Official opening of €18.7m N56 Coolboy to Kilmacrennan Scheme

Minister for Education and Skills, Joe McHugh TD and Cathaoirleach of Donegal County Council, Cllr. Nicholas Crossan officially opened the €18.7m, N56 Coolboy to Kilmacrennan Scheme last October.

The 3.1km scheme is a key transport corridor to the north west of Donegal including Glenveagh National Park, Donegal Airport and the Gaeltacht.

BAM commenced works in January 2018 and completed the project in 18 months. Alongside the new road, a 2-meter shared footway/cycle track has been created on both sides of the road

and it is hoped that this new shared track will be extended to Letterkenny.

The delivery of this scheme is a continuation of the N56 Mountaintop to Illistrin project completed in 2009. The original road had a narrow carriage way, no significant verge and a number of poorly aligned junctions, accesses and entrances. The new

scheme involved the widening and realignment to a 7-meter carriageway with hard strips and verges.

In collaboration with this project, Irish Water constructed a new trunk watermain and distributor water mains serving Letterkenny and its environs adjacent to and along the N56.

The course aim was to train employees who require a basic understanding of how to use Navisworks to review 3D models to ensure clash free and constructible design.

This software allows users to open and combine 3D models, navigate around them in realtime and review the model using a set of tools including comments, redlining, viewpoint, and measurements. A selection of plug-ins enhances the package adding interference detection, 4D time simulation, photo-realistic rendering and PDF-like publishing.
